## YELLOWSTONE BISON QUARANTINE PROGRAM RESOLUTION

## Whereas

a treaty was signed by the undersigned signatories, namely "The Buffalo: A Treaty Of Cooperation, Renewal, And Restoration" in September, 2014 ('The Buffalo Treaty' from herein);

the signatories promised to welcome back the buffalo and collectively work together to provide a safe environment for the buffalo;

the signatories recognize the buffalo as a practitioner of conservation and collectively agree to perpetuate conservation by respecting the interrelationship between us and 'all our relations' including animals, plants, and mother earth; to perpetuate and continue our spiritual ceremonies, sacred societies, sacred languages, and sacred bundles as a means to embody the thoughts and beliefs of ecological balance;

the buffalo is foundational to our customs, practices, harvesting, beliefs, songs, and ceremonies;

the Yellowstone bison are considered by scientists to be the only ecologically and genetically viable population of plains bison and as a valuable resource for restoration purposes due to its genetic lineage;

in view of the fact that Yellowstone bison have been infected with brucellosis in the past by other bovine animals such as elk and deer;

the National Park Service is in the process of developing a multi-stage quarantine program to ensure disease-free bison and reduce the number of Yellowstone bison being sent to slaughter;

the Fort Peck Reservation is a preferred alternate quarantine situs for the National Park Service;

the Assiniboine and Sioux tribes of the Fort Peck Reservation have the capacity to contribute towards disease-free bison by being a part of the planned quarantine program;

the National Park Service planned quarantine program will contribute to a healty gene pool for plains bison;
